School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2018-19 educational progress for the Voyageur College Prep. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given any of these labels.

CHALLENGES:

Over the last few years at Voyageur College Prep, one of our key challenges has been creating a rigorous academic environment that truly prepares students for the rigors of college. As data from State and National assessments indicate and in reviewing the combined report, many students enter high school with gaps in their knowledge base which makes creating implementing a truly rigorous curriculum difficult. High School then becomes a place to try to catch students up instead of pushing them to excel to higher and higher levels in order to be prepared for college success.

Initiatives:

As a result, we continue to implement key initiatives to accelerate student learning and increase academic achievement such as:

- Interim Assessment system designed to identify and assess key skills and content that students need to be successful on state and national exams that determine college admittance.
- Bi-weekly data meetings w/core teachers to identify gaps in scholar learning and develop lesson plans that target scholar gaps
- Differentiated and individualize professional development programs for teachers including bi-weekly classroom observations and debriefs
- Academic Intervention Program from students who are struggling in one or more classes
- Providing SAT Preparatory courses
- Implementation of College Board Springboard Curriculum to be better aligned to PSAT/SAT and Common Core Standards
- Partnering w/Ferris State University and to provide scholars with access to dual enrollment opportunities (Upward Bound Program)
- Offering academic tutoring programs before, during, and after school
- MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) Program to identify and assist struggling learners
- o Differentiated Instruction in classrooms to reach all scholars
- Credit Recovery Programs to ensure students remain on track for graduation
- o Push-In & Pull-Out services to assist our Special Education and bilingual population

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

VCP students are admitted to the school through an open enrollment process by the order in which they apply. This was the process for the 2016-2017, 2017-2018, and 2018-2019 school years.

By law, VCP cannot restrict enrollment based on selection criteria. VCP can, however, limit the total number of students who may attend the school. If there are more applicants than open spaces during the open enrollment period, students are then admitted through a random selection process.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Voyageur College Prep is committed to creating an environment that promotes teaching and learning and prepares our students with the skills, knowledge, and habits of mind necessary to be successful in and graduate from college. During the 2014-2015 school year, the Voyageur College Prep staff designed and implemented systems that worked to transform the culture of achievement at Voyageur College Prep. Systems and program designs include the implementation of a rigorous college preparatory curriculum (aligned with the College Readiness Standards, the SAT, and Advanced Placement Standards), and a strong disciplinary program to promote positive academic behaviors, and an advisory program to ensure scholars have the opportunity to attend and be successful in college.

In the 2015-2016 School Year we shifted more of our focus to increasing the academic rigor in our classes. We introduced Advanced Placement Classes, used more data (collected from our Interim

Assessments) to inform decisions in the classroom, and leveraged Princeton Review for more intensive skill development for our 11th Graders.

The Voyageur College Prep School Improvement Plan (SIP) was revised for the 2017-2018 school year after careful analysis of student achievement data (M-Step, PSAT/SAT). This is a living document and is revised each year based on new data. This plan includes 6 goal areas: Mathematics, Writing, Reading, Science, Social Studies, and Creating a Positive School Culture with a focus on Culture and Climate. A major change in the educational program of VCP in the 2017-2018 school year is the inclusion of a "Pre-College Seminar" course for all 11th grade scholars with a strong focus on SAT preparation using the PrepWorks platform.

During the 2018-2019 school year, VCP included a Freshman and Sophomore Seminar course for all 9th and 10th grade scholars to our SIP. This program has a focus on assessment prep for the PSAT. Furthermore, we added the Illuminate Assessment to our SIP for grades 9th-12th. Illuminate equips teachers with extensive content and professionally-designed assessments, that transforms tests into instructional tools that drive learning. It has easily accessible dashboards that allows our educators to know where each site, classroom, and student stand.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Voyageur College Prep (VCP) is a College Preparatory Public Charter School Authorized by Ferris State University and managed by The Romine Group. VCP provides all scholars with a rigorous, college preparatory education that will allow them to develop the skills, knowledge, habits and mindsets necessary to be successful at the collegiate level and graduate with a degree. It is not a specialized school.

Special Education Services at VCP:

VCP provides a full continuum of services for scholars eligible for Special Education Placement:

- Cognitive Impairment
- Specific Learning Disabilities
- Emotionally Impaired
- Other Health Impairment (OHI)
- Speech and Language Impairment
- Section 504

4. IDENTIFY HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM, A DESCRIPTION OF ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EXPLANATION OF THE VARIANCES FROM THE STATE'S MODEL

The school's curriculum is aligned with the Common Core Standards (for Mathematics & English Language Arts) and the Michigan High School Content Expectations (HSCEs). Our curriculum is structured to provide Voyageur College Prep scholars with the core foundational knowledge and skills necessary to be successful in college and later in whatever career they choose to pursue. The Michigan high school graduation requirements are designed to prepare students for college or other post-secondary studies if satisfactorily completed. The sequence of courses offered to students over four years exceeds the basic requirement of the State of Michigan in order to ensure our students are ready for the rigors of college. Through the implementation of our interim assessment system (aligned

with the SAT) we are able to determine mastery of a content and skills for each core subject area at each grade level and ensure students are learning what they need in order to be ready for and successful in college. As previously stated, Voyageur College Prep offers more than the basic curriculum mandated for high school graduation by the state of Michigan: four years of English, four years of mathematics, four years of social studies, four years of science, two years of foreign language, four years of physical education and fitness, at least one year of art, and at least one credit of an on-line/ technology course. Additionally, beginning with the class of 2017, all VCP scholars are required to take at least 1 AP course in order to graduate so that we can ensure scholars are exposed to college-level rigor while in high school. This was true for VCP for 2016-2017 and in 2017-2018. AP courses were not offered during the 2018-2019 school year.
